Dear Licensee:

Your request to extend the term of your existing Forest Stewardship Plan (FSP) has now been fully reviewed.

I am satisfied that the proposal to extend the term of the FSP has been made in accordance with Sections 5 and 6(2) of the *Forest and Range Practices Act* and the regulations.

In my decision, I have considered guidance from the Chief Forester on FSP extension and replacement and the fact that the forest resource and expectations have changed dramatically since the approval of the original FSP. A shorter term will still allow you to meet your operational needs and provide adequate time to assess information from both provincial and regional letters of expectation that you should receive shortly. Accordingly, as the statutory decision maker under Section 16 of the *Forest and Range Practices Act*, I hereby am approving the extension of the term of your FSP.

The new term of the FSP is one year and will commence December 23, 2015.
